Building Blocks 2023



A new series of Building Blocks will begin on Wednesday, January 11 and last for six weeks. The new series features three new and exciting option.

- The Way of Christian Mysticism: Persons who have discovered the path of Christian mysticism have become aware of the immediate presence of God in all things and in all persons and of their own oneness with the Great Mystery of God.
