A Journey in Four Verses

One of my favorite hymns is "O, Sing a Song of Bethlehem" (Tune: KINGSFOLD). The tune was given the name for where it 'discovered' (Kingsfold, Sussex, was England) by Ralph Vaughan Williams (my favorite composer). The tune is actually a medieval folk tune from England and Ireland, and is set in a minor key. What I love about this hymn besides the beautiful melody (which we sang as our final hymn on Epiphany), are the moving words written by Louis F. Benson (1855-1930). Each successive verse speaks of different places and events in Christ's life. The first verse details Christ's humble birth in Bethlehem, the visiting shepherds, the angels, and the joyful news of His coming to Earth. The second verse talks of Nazareth, the childhood of Jesus, and that His fame was beginning to spread. The third verse speaks of Galilee and of Jesus walking on water and calming the storm. The fourth verse leads us to Calvary and Christ's death upon the cross; however, the final lines detail His rising from the grave, and His salvation for all mankind. I find this Hymn the perfect segue from Epiphany to the coming season of Lent, which begins on February 22 with Ash Wednesday. I invite you to be aware of your own personal places, both physical and spiritual, as we make our way forward into Lent. Consider your own personal journey this year, as you seek to renew your commitment to our physical church FBC Greenwood, and the broader world-wide church. May your faith find hope and renewal.



Library Corner, February 2023

Revisiting the January 2023 Connections Newsletter prompted me to consider how the church library might Connect with the variety of New Year's opportunities for Spiritual Formation at First Baptist. Relevant to Building Blocks, the library has an extensive collection of books on contemplative worship. Christian mysticism and spiritual formation, David Ramsev's book. Oldest CIAs Learn about Worship and Plan Children's Ash Wednesday Service


