THE SEASON OF LENT

By the time you receive this newsletter, First Baptist will be in the midst of the season of Lent. Lent is the 40-day period that begins with Ash Wednesday and concludes with the celebration of Easter. The length of the season matches the 40 days that Jesus spent in the wilderness preparing to begin his earthly ministry.

We observe Lent as a time of reflection and repentance. Some may choose to give up certain things they enjoy in order to heighten the focus of their reflection. Others my choose some type of fasting practice. One may also choose to emphasize increased giving during this time or commitment to a service project as a means of increasing one's focus.

This year Lent occurs during a special time in the life of our church. As the Transition Team continues its work under the leadership of Dr. Layne Smith, the congregation will be invited to participate in a series of events designed to help us focus our reflections on the life and ministry of First Baptist Greenwood. You will be asked to reflect on the best times in the history of the church and on the times when the church has had to struggle. You will be asked to evaluate the current ministries and programs of the church. You will also be asked to reflect on what the church needs to do and be in order to continue to fulfill our calling as followers of Jesus in today's world. All of this will prepare the congregation to seek, under the leadership of the Holy Spirit, the next person to pastor this wonderful church.

Just as you would in reflecting on your own life, I urge you to devote time to praying for the church and its leadership during this Lenten season. I said in the February 12 sermon that I am convinced that the Holy Spirit does its most effective work when a diverse group of people seek the Spirit's leadership. I am confident that by prayerfully seeking that leadership you will ensure that this church's best and most faithful days are ahead.

Music Notes J.S. Bach Sunday, and "Dry Bones"

We celebrate the 338th birthday of Johann Sebastian Bach (1685-1750) on March 21 (N.S.) or March 31 (O.S.), depending on which calendar you consult, either the Old Style (O.S.) or New Style (N.S.). J.S. Bach was one of the greatest composers of all time, especially of church music, with over 200 cantatas, the St. John Passion and St. Matthew Passion, Christmas Oratorio (actually Christmas six performed together), the beautiful and joyful Magnificat, motets, organ Preludes and Fugues, and harmonizations of hymns and chorale tunes. On Sunday, March 26, the Chancel Choir will be singing the ever popular "Jesu, Joy of Man's Desiring" as part of the Prelude. It comes from Cantata BWV 147 Herz und Mund und Tat und Leben ("Heart and Mouth and Deed and Life"). The lyrics were written by Martin Janus (Jahn) in 1661, and our English translation is from Robert Bridges. The piece is frequently used at weddings, or during Christmas or Easter seasons. The familiar melody (3-notes on one beat) slowly rising and falling can sound like water flowing, or a gentle wind blowing, with the choir singing the chorale at moments between these triplet instrumental sections. In addition to this beautiful piece, the congregation will be joining in the great PASSION CHORALE "O Sacred Head Now Wounded," harmonized by J.S. Bach.

Also, on that Sunday, Carlton speaks about Ezekiel prophesying to the dry bones and the Lord covering the bones with flesh and breathing new life into them. The Chancel Choir will be singing the fantastic and rousing African-American spiritual "Dry Bones." It promises to be a special Sunday of varied and wonderful music during our Lenten journey.

Since cards will be available in the church office for to send to recipients, acknowledgements of these gifts will be sent by the church office.



Adult Building Blocks

A new eight week Building Blocks series will begin on Wednesday, March 1 and conclude on Wednesday, April 26. The new series features four exciting options.

Esther and Joseph: Carole Russell, the leader of this study, says, "Looking at the Book of Esther, we will see more than her beauty. As the story unfolds, problems become victories and God joyfully and dependably protects His own." After studying Esther for four weeks, the group will explore the life of Joseph.
