# A Note from the Pastor

We rejoice in the blessing of a strong financial finish to fiscal year 2024! Did you know that we ended the year with a \$28,000 overage thanks to faithful giving and careful stewardship? In a spirit of generosity and vision, the Stewardship Committee voted to allocate these funds to Missions, Youth, Children, Properties, and Music ministries—empowering them to think creatively and expand their impact in new and meaningful ways. We were able to make this choice even in the midst of a slow start to 2025 because of our strong fund balance and the diligent work the staff continues to do managing expenses.

This moment of abundance aligns beautifully with our Full-To-The-Brim Lenten journey, reminding us that God's blessings overflow and that we are called to share that abundance. As we prepare our hearts for Easter, we look forward to the ultimate proclamation of new life: Christ is risen! We invite everyone to begin this joyous day by gathering for a church-wide Easter breakfast at 9:00 a.m.—a time of fellowship and celebration as we share in the joy of the resurrection together.

One of our Easter traditions is the flowered cross, a visual representation of resurrection and renewal. We encourage everyone to bring fresh flowers on Easter morning to transform the cross into a vibrant display of hope. This tradition reminds us that God takes what is broken and breathes new life into it - leveraging resurrection power.

The Flower Ministry continues this sacred work, ensuring that the beauty of Easter is shared with all. During breakfast, before Sunday School, and after worship, families and individuals are encouraged to take part in professional photos with Trinity Photography in front of the flowered cross. The cross will be placed under the covered driveway, providing ideal lighting for photos and a meaningful way to celebrate Christ's victory over death. After Trinity shares the images with FBC, the church will make digital versions of family photos available.

With Full-To-The-Brim hearts, we move forward in faith, celebrating God's provision and the opportunity to invest in ministries that will continue to bless our church and community.


