Music Notes

A L L E L U I A, and the "Coronation" of Jesus Our King

Happy Easter season! We now celebrate the Resurrection and shout "He Is Risen!" and "Alleluia" in our worship services. The return of our "Alleluias" signals that the forty days of Lenten reflection have led us to a time of spiritual celebration of the sacrifice of Jesus and the promise of eternal life through Jesus Christ's resurrection and conquering of death on the cross.

We will offer hymns and anthems of celebration during the coming months. One of my favorite hymns is "All Hail the Power of Jesus' Name" with words written by Edward Perronet in 1779. He was a close friend of the Wesleys, and was active in their work in England. Perronet was the son of an Anglican priest, and when he became convinced that the Wesleyan movement should separate from the Anglican Church, and they would not go with him, he left their group and formed his own independent church in Canterbury. He wrote the great hymn "All Hail the Power of Jesus' Name" expressing joy and praise in religion, majesty of the heavenly arena, and evoking the spirit of the evangelistic movement. The Tune is known as CORONATION and coincides with the coronation of Jesus as our King. Many of the hymns during this Easter season will feature texts and verses that offer praise to the royal image of Christ as our King and Savior...

Bring forth the royal diadem and crown Him Lord of all. Alleluia. Amen.

During the interim period, I frequently heard a desire expressed for the church to grow. If that's a goal you share, I encourage you to consider serving in our Children's Ministry. Invest in our children—teach them, spend time with them, welcome them into worship and events, attend their activities, or help care for them during extended session. There is room for you in Children's Ministry to do the kingdom work of shepherding and loving our children.

After stepping away from my staff role and taking a short break, I look forward to continuing to serve and worship alongside you as a fellow member of First Baptist Church.
