I appreciate this opportunity to express to you how profoundly thankful Carlton and I were to have had the honor of spending the last 6 months with you. Josh Harrington's Last Sunday

In addition to playing organ and piano for services, he has conducted the Handbell Choir, the Youth Choir and taken the Youth Choir to YouthCue in Washington, DC last year. He has played for weddings, funerals, special services, and been a valued member of this church family. His gifts and talents are immeasurable, and Josh will be greatly missed by everyone here. "A Closer Walk"

This month the Chancel Choir will sing a new arrangement of the popular song "Just a Closer Walk with Thee." The song, thought to originate in the African American churches prior to the Civil War. was first written down and published in 1940 by Kenneth Morris. On a train ride from Kansas City to Chicago, Morris stopped to get some fresh air and heard a station porter singing a song. He boarded the train again but kept thinking of the melody and words. At the next stop, he exited the train to take another train back to the station. He asked the porter to sing the song again, this time writing down the melody and lyrics. With some added lyrics, Morris published the song "Just a Closer Walk with Thee." It has since become a gospel song and jazz standard, and has been recorded by countless artists. "Just a Closer Walk with Thee" has become the most frequently played song during the hymn and dirge sections at traditional New Orleans Jazz Funerals. This new arrangement blends the gospel roots with jazz harmonies to create a deeply moving, expressive anthem.



Corporate Prayer Time Opportunities

Praying together, even if that prayer is self-directed is powerful and a reminder that we are not alone in our petitions to God. For the next several weeks, you are invited to the chapel for a time of prayer. on Wednesday nights (5:45 pm -6:15 pm) and Sunday mornings (9:15 am-9:45 am). Of course, anyone can pray in the chapel anytime the church is opened. "The light that was Carlton Allen will continue to burn brightly in the hearts and memories of us all."

Saddened as we are by the loss of Dr. Carlton Allen, we are grateful to have at least two publications in our church library to remind us of Carlton's faith and friendship.

Walk With Me is a collection of memories, reflections and essays celebrating the life of Dr. James M. Pitts, former chaplain at Furman University, who died in 2021. In his contributing chapter, Carlton relates how influential Dr. Pitts was in his (Carlton's) becoming a youth minister at Greenwood First Baptist Church in his first place of service following graduation from Southern Baptist Theological Seminary. Carlton also shares how Jim was the guidance and inspiration for his book:

August Diaconate Update

The August Diaconate meeting was held at 7:00 pm on Sunday, August 20. In addition to receiving reports from the staff, the Diaconate approved a proposal by the Property Committee to upgrade the church kitchen with an additional new convection oven, new dishwasher/sanitizer, and a new fast recovery hot water heater. The upgrade to the church kitchen will be paid for by an anonymous donor.

The Diaconate was also given a preview of the Draft 2024 Ministry Plan that was presented to the congregation on Sunday, August 27. During the meeting, the Diaconate voted to reduce gifts to CBF Global and CBFSC by fifteen percent.

The Diaconate also approved a recommendation by the First Baptist Transition Team to ask Rev. Dr. Layne Smith to serve as Interim Senior Pastor. Layne will begin his new duties as Interim Senior Pastor on Tuesday, September 5.
