Acts 16 speaks of the Apostle Paul's desire to go to Asia Minor (current day Turkey) to share/spread the Gospel. Paul and Timothy ...went through the region of Phrygia and Galatia, having been forbidden by the Holy Spirit to speak the word in Asia and ...they attempted to go into Bithynia, but the Spirit of Jesus did not allow them. (Acts 16:6-8 NRSV). Things did not turn out like Paul wanted or imagined, did it? However, Paul and Timothy, empowered by God's Holy Spirit were able to do amazing ministry.

Likewise, things do not always turn out like we want, think, or hope that they will. Two plus months ago, I never dreamed that beginning in September I would be serving as your Interim Senior Pastor. Things were going along well. The Transition Team was nearing the end of their work. The Senior Pastor Search Committee was in the process of being nominated and elected. Then, the unimaginable happened. Like you, I was utterly stunned, shocked, and deeply saddened by the news of Carlton's death. This is not what Carlton's family, what this church, or what I "signed" up for. This is not how it was supposed to turn out.

However, I continue to affirm Romans 8:28 (NRSV). We know that all things work together for good for those who love God, who are called according to his purpose.

First, you and I are called according to God's purpose. As followers of Jesus, we have a calling, as Jesus reminded first century and twenty-first century disciples, 'You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind and with all your strength.' The second is this, 'You shall love your neighbor as yourself.' There is no other commandment greater than these. (Mark 12:30-31 NRSV)

Second, the Romans scripture DOES NOT say that everything that happens to us individually and/or corporately is "good." No, it states that God is at work through the joy, grief, good, bad, and everything else in our lives to somehow, some way, bring some kind of healing and good. FBC has been experiencing loss and grief. My prayer is that we will allow God to work in our midst to bring redemption, healing, and yes, someway, good. I am honored to be on this journey with you. Let's pray for each other, offer grace to each other, and love each other authentically as Jesus calls us to do. Like Paul and Timothy, who did amazing ministry even when things didn't turn out like they wanted, I believe that FBC will continue to do amazing ministry in Greenwood and beyond.

Third Quarter Missions

The Stewardship Committee met on Wednesday, September 20, and discussed payment of third guarter missions. Given the fact the church was behind in revenue to expenses at the end of August by \$56,963.54 and a full mission payment is approximately \$21,000.00, the committee voted to do the following:

- Pay 85% of the missions payment to CBF Global, CBF SC, and Special Mission Emphasis to include Baptist Women in Ministry and Janee Angel.
- Pay 50% of the missions payment to local missions partners.

The committee also voted not to send third guarter funds to Greenwood Habitat for Humanity, Greenwood Soup Kitchen, International Ministries, and A Voice for Children.

With the reductions just mentioned, the third quarter missions payment will be \$13,042.50, a reduction of \$8,732.50.
