Music Notes

A Lesson and a Carol: "Are We There Yet?"

The service of Nine Lessons and Carols will be on Sunday, December 17, with anthems sung by the Chancel Choir, Voices of Grace, and Sounds of Grace. We will be joined by quest organist Robert Wilson, and instrumentalists, plus various readers and soloists. One of the carols within the service will be "How Far Is It to Bethlehem", which I am arranging for the choir and instrumentalists. It reminds me of children on a long cross-country automobile journey asking their parents: "Are We There Yet?" It is a beautiful, simple carol filled with such longing and questioning... How far is it? Will the room be lit by a star? Can we go inside? Can we see the tiny child? Can we touch His hand? Will there be animals there? Can we pet them too? The final verse, with words by Christina Rosetti, are familiar but worth repeating. It is one of my favorite verses of all Christmas carols, and a lesson to remember during this season of anticipation, longing, and expectation:

O what can I give to Him, poor as I am? If I were a shepherd, I'd bring a lamb; If I were a wise man, I'd do my part; Yet what can I give to Him? Give Him my heart.

Let's go on this journey together, and give Him our time, our presence, our love, and our hearts.

- The Diaconate approved a motion to create a Diaconate Ad-hoc committee to study the process of developing the annual Ministry Plan.

As First Baptist approaches the last month of 2023, the the October financial report reflects a deficit between revenue and expenses of \$89,332.73. Based on the 2023 monthly financial report (and shared each month in the Ministry Plan section of the newsletter), the average revenue needed each month to meet the annual Ministry Plan is \$83.984.96. Gifts to the Ministry Plan for the month of October were \$69,439.65. Therefore, the deficit for the month of October was \$14,545.31. Your help is needed to "finish strong" by the end of the year! Annual Meeting Update

Thanks to everyone who participated in the 2023 Annual meeting. Special "thanks" to the Congregational Life Committee for the chili supper prior to the meeting. The chili was delicious!

As a result of the Annual Meeting, those in attendance approved the following agenda items.

- 1) Approved the minutes of the 2022 Annual Meeting as well as Called Business Meeting throughout the year.
- 2) Approved the election of church officers for 2024:
 - Pat Penn Assistant Church Treasurer
 - Alan Ogles Church Clerk
- 3) Approved the list of 2024-2026 **Committee Members**
- 4) Approved the 2024 Ministry Plan



Because First Baptist is behind in revenue to expenses at the end of October by \$89,332.73, the Stewardship Committee voted to pay fourth guarter missions at the same level as third quarter. Therefore, the Stewardship Committee voted to...

- Pay 85% of the missions payment to CBF Global, CBF SC, and Special Mission Emphasis to include Baptist Women in Ministry and Janee Angel.
- Pay 50% of the missions payment to local missions partners.

The committee also voted not to send fourth guarter funds to Greenwood Habitat for Humanity, Greenwood Soup Kitchen, International Ministries, and A Voice for Children.

With the reductions just mentioned, the fourth quarter missions payment will be \$13.042.50. a reduction of \$8.732.50.
