




Praying the Stations of the Cross

The Stations of the Cross provide an opportunity to follow the path Jesus took without the need for travel. The Stations of the Cross highlight fourteen key events in Jesus' journey to the cross. Various artists and poets from First Baptist Church and the community have submitted pieces for the fourteen Stations of the Cross that will be positioned throughout the church and grounds. (A brochure with directions will be provided.) The stations will be available March 17–March 29 from 1:00 pm-5:00 pm, with the exception of Saturday, March 23. Everyone is invited to a covered dish lunch after worship today. During lunch the artists and poets will be introduced, and the journey through the stations will be explained.

Opportunities to Honor or Remember for Easter

On Easter Sunday, First Baptist will publish a list of donors and those honored or remembered through a special offering during Lent. Honor donations and memorial donations may be designated for the Beverly Greer Offering for State Missions or for the Ministry Plan. *Unfortunately, the florist moved the date for lily orders, so the deadline to order lilies has passed.* Donation in honor or in memory of someone must be given by next Sunday, March 24, to have the name listed in the March 31 bulletin. Checks should be made payable to First Baptist Church. A form is in the church office for donors to indicate where the donation is to go and who is being honored or remembered. Since cards will be available in the church office for donors to send to recipients, no acknowledgements of these gifts will be sent by the church office.

March/April Building Blocks: "All About Missions"

During March and April, the Missions Committee is leading an overview in the Fellowship Hall of some of the First Baptist's local missions partners. Each Wednesday a representative from a local missions partner will be on hand to give a brief presentation followed by a time for discussion, questions and answers, and, during some sessions, a hands-on activity such as writing letters to veterans and overseas military personnel; preparing Easter cards for Meals on Wheels; making bowls for the Greenwood Soup Kitchen *Empty Bowls* and more. This is a wonderful time to get involved with our missions partners and learn how First Baptist can continue to grow in our mission to serve Christ.

Next Sunday, **Palm Sunday** (**March 24**), all children are invited to carry palm fronds to the altar during the processional. (Every time the word "Alleluia" is sung the children will ring their bells.) On both of these Sundays, someone will be in the Narthex at 10:45 am to distribute palms or bells.

March is Baptist Women in Ministry Month of Advocacy

The list below, copied and adapted from the Baptist Women in Ministry website, suggests ways to advocate for women in ministry. First Baptist Greenwood can be proud that it is already taking many of these actions. Still, more can be done.

- Lead various church groups through studies related to women in ministry such as the updated version of *A Baptist Reflection on the Bible and Women in Ministry and Leadership* by Meredith Stone or *Equally Called*, a 4-session video and curriculum resource produced by BWIM and CBF
- Use BWIM social media graphics to create awareness in your network and community
- Advocate for ordination, pay equity, paid paternity leave, and professional development opportunities for women in ministry, and for women to be elected to community and denominational boards and committees
- Evaluate ministerial titles for women in your church, the art in your church, and the songs and liturgies used in your corporate worship. Make needed adjustments so titles, visuals, and worship materials reflect equality and have inclusive language for people and expansive language for God
- Give a scholarship to a woman preparing for ministry
- Schedule sexual misconduct, harassment, and assault training for leaders in your congregation
- Donate to support a woman missionary whose work benefits women
- Find a tangible way to encourage the women who serve as chaplains
- Engage biblical support for women in ministry and women's equality in Bible studies, sermons, and youth/children's lessons
- Implement spiritual formation resources that are empowering to women and girls
- Start a book club about the challenges that women face in the church
- Host an experienced woman in ministry to visit with younger women about discerning a call to ministry
- Evaluate and restructure lay leadership in your congregation to intentionally include women in all levels of leadership (deacon body, church council, committees, etc.)
- Utilize liturgical resources that highlight women in the liturgical texts .
- If you are a male minister or leader, find one opportunity that you have been given which you might be able to share with a woman instead of accepting it yourself
- Partner in the ways Baptist Women in Ministry advocates for women in ministry by giving an individual or congregational donation or by becoming a Salome Community monthly donor
- Attend a screening near you of BWIM's documentary Midwives of a Movement.


