



Called Business Meeting on Sunday April 7

A Called Business Meeting, for the purpose of extending a call to the new Senior Pastor, will take place after the morning worship service on Sunday, April 7. Paper ballots will be used for the business session. Absentee voting will not be available for the calling of a new Senior Pastor. The new senior pastor candidate comes as a unanimous recommendation from the Senior Pastor Search Committee and the Diaconate.

The Senior Pastor Search Committee would like to extend an invitation to the First Baptist Church family to a drop-in reception on Saturday, April 6, to meet the Senior Pastor candidate and their family. The drop-in reception will be held in the Fellowship Hall from 3:00 pm to 5:00 pm.

The Senior Pastor candidate will give their testimony in the Sanctuary during the 10:00 am Sunday School hour on Sunday, April 7. Following the Sunday School hour, the candidate will preach during the 11:00 am worship service.

Due to confidentiality between the Senior Pastor Search Committee and the candidate, specific details concerning the candidate will not be made public until the reception on April 6. It is imperative that confidentiality be maintained until a call is extended to the candidate and they have had an opportunity to notify their current congregation. Therefore, please refrain from sharing ANY information about the candidate (name, picture, etc.) by email and/or social media.
